THE SOUTHERN AFGHAN CLUB - JUDGES' CRITERIA

'C' LIST

- a) To have attended an Afghan Hound Breed seminar
- b) To have shown an interest in the Breed and to have the support of The Southern Afghan Club
- c) To have stewarded a minimum of twelve classes

'B' LIST (BREED SPECIALIST)

- a) To have attended **3** Afghan Hound Breed seminars
- b) To have passed an Afghan Hound Breed Club examination
- c) To have judged a minimum of 24 classes of Afghan Hounds or alternatively a total of 40 Afghan Hounds
- d) To have stewarded a minimum of **4** shows of not less than **3** classes
- e) To have owned and been exhibiting in the Breed for a minimum of **6** years

'B' LIST (NON SPECIALIST)

- a) To have attended **3** Afghan Hound Breed seminars
- b) To have passed an Afghan Hound Breed Club examination
- c) To award Challenge Certificates in 1 other breed
- d) To have judged **24** classes of Afghan Hounds spanning a minimum period of **6** years

C.C. LIST (A1, A2 & A3)

- a) 7 years' active experience in the Breed (*waived in the case of all-rounders*)
- b) To have judged **75** classes of Afghan Hounds at open show level spanning a minimum period of **7** years
- c) To have judged both sexes separately at an Afghan Hound Breed Club show or Breed Club sponsored show either at one show or two separate shows
- d) To have judged a minimum of 160 Afghan Hounds (classes judged jointly will not be counted)
- e) To have bred or owned a minimum of **3** Afghan Hounds when they obtained their **1**st entry into the KC Stud Book (where joint interest is proven, partners receive equal status in ownership)
- f) To have stewarded at not less than 12 shows
- g) To have passed a recognised Afghan Hound Breed Club examination

A3 Only

- h) To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures
- i) To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement
- j) To have attended either a 'Conformation & Movement Hands-on Assessment' or a 'Points of the Dog Assessment' conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and to have passed the assessment
- k) To have attended at **3** Afghan Hound breed specific seminars run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable

ALL-ROUNDERS

To have attended an Afghan Hound breed specific seminar and have passed an Afghan Hound Breed Club examination

To have awarded C.C.s in 3 breeds; have judged a minimum of 50 classes of Afghan Hounds at open show level over a minimum period of 7 years and to have judged at least 160 dogs
To have judged at least 1 Afghan Hound Breed Club Open show

In the case of applications from all-rounders to be included on any of the above lists, the necessity of ownership and involvement with Afghans is waived.

OVERSEAS IUDGES

Overseas applicants will be judged on their individual merits.
